About the Resource.

The Transformation Game® has been developed at the Findhorn Foundation in northern Scotland over more than 20 years. It enables you to identify a life purpose and to explore how your patterns, beliefs and experiences can influence your opportunities. Engaging in the process with a group of up to four people and a facilitator will help you to recognise your strengths, review and resolve challenges, and explore new possibilities. You will have the opportunity to exercise initiative and imagination, to share with and support others, and to make your own choices and decisions.

About the Findhorn Unitarian Network Transformation Game ® Facilitators

Both Anjali Diwan and Ralph Catts have completed an intensive training programme and are accredited facilitators of the Transformation Game ®.

Anjali is a social care professional and a Reiki Master. She is based near London and works on the South West Coast. She offers opportunities to experience the Transformation Game ® in and around London, South East, South West UK and in other parts of the UK where travel and accommodation can be provided. Anjali has been on a journey of Transformation with many people and is offering solo, small or larger groups of up to six people the opportunity to connect with Transformation Games through Zoom/ Skype, until the pandemic settles down and is safe to be on this journey face to face again.

Revd Dr Ralph Catts is a retired Unitarian Minister who is now based in Australia, and offers opportunities to take part in the experience in Australia, and face to face sessions when in the UK. During the current pandemic he is not conducting sessions, but plans to offer an opportunity in the UK to take part in the experience in a retreat setting in 2021, provided restrictions are lifted.

About Costs:

The fee to participate depends upon the duration of the game and the location. The fee will be set based upon the costs which include the venue hire, (could be zero if chapel offers); travel costs for the facilitator (could be zero if near by), accommodation (could be zero if near facilitator home for a one day game), and the cost of resources (e.g. participant note book, writing equipment, teas and coffees), could be provided by participants and / or the church).

In addition, each Facilitator may set their own fee which will be a predetermined amount, and the number of participants will determine the cost per participant. In addition, as part of the Game conclusion each participant is asked to make a voluntary donation by attunement to FUN to provide for future FUN events for people with low incomes.
